

NCSSAR GROUND TEAM ESSENTIALS

□- Class B Uniform with layered clothing,	□ - GPS
outerwear, headwear and footwear	$\hfill\Box$ - food/water for duration of search
appropriate for weather and location	□ - paper/pen
□ - pack appropriate for searcher Type	□ - compass
□ - updated NCSSAR Alert Roster	□ - flashlight/headlamp
□ - radios - CLEMARS/FRS	□ - extra batteries

RADIO PROCEDURE

- Speak slowly and clearly in plain English, use 10 codes where appropriate keeping message brief and to the point
- Use assigned team number for team radio communication
- Use SAR call sign for one-on-one communication
- Write down information such as coordinates prior to communicating with IC
- Use proper radio etiquette

"IC, Ground Team 2", "copy", "negative" "affirmative", etc. Refrain from using proper names while speaking on CLEMARS frequency

• Communicate UTM coordinates in 5x5 format

GROUND TEAM PROCEDURE CHECKLIST

Upon Call out

- The search begins when you receive the call out. Be observant while driving to the scene.
- Go to staging area and wait for team formation and assignment

At Briefing

- Obtain map of search area (if applicable)
- Obtain information on missing person or evidence for search
- Obtain a Team Debriefing Form

Prior to Deployment to Search Area

- Establish within your team duties such as leader, radio communications, and navigator
- Check battery levels of all electronic devices
- Turn ON FRS to assigned channel
- Turn ON CLEMARS radio and perform a radio check with IC
- Turn ON GPS
 - -calibrate GPS compass (if GPS model includes this feature) at beginning of search and anytime batteries have been changed
 - -check datum (Nevada County- UTM/UPS—NAD 27 CONUS)
 - -waypoint IC
 - -add search area segment to your GPS
 - -keep TRACKS OFF until you reach search area

Arriving at Search Area

- Contact IC to advise you have begun your search
- Turn TRACKS ON on GPS
- Look for clues. Clues lead to the subject
- While searching look UP, look DOWN, look LEFT, look RIGHT, and turn around to look BACK

While Searching

- Look up, down, left, right and turn around to look back
- Mark position of clues on GPS
- Flag clues for evidence
- Estimate POD for each area searched
- Make notes
- Call and stop to listen
- DO NOT disturb evidence!

Upon Completing Search of Area

- Turn TRACKS OFF on GPS when leaving search area
- Return to IC with completed debriefing form and report in for debrief
- Turn OFF all electronic devices
